Hanging Tree."

Rumored to be over 200 years old, this 50 foot oak was a staple on our main street bearing a reputation, whether fictional or fact, that it was used by Circuit Court Judges to order swift justice during Duarte's wild west days. It witnessed many changes on Duarte's Main Street from the days Andres Duarte rode his stallion along the dusty paths to the rise and fall of both the citrus ranches and Route 66. Pieces of this icon of the history of Duarte and Route 66 will be polished and sold at the museum as keepsakes.
